## Communications

A letter from the Secretary of the Vol. Fire Dept. was read, in which the Council was notified of the election of Clayton Yoder as Fire Chief for 1946, and desiring the concurrence of the Council.

The pecorder then read the findings of the Clackamas County Grand jury in respect to the conditions of the various jails in the County. This was in the nature of a report made to Judge Latourette and sent out by the County Clerk.

Also communication from League of Oregon Cities relative to convention soon to be held in Portland and giving details of programme.

## Reports

Supt. Lent reported that electric line load was increasing all the time on account of many new stoves, refrigerators, etc. being installed. Also that he was behind in the work, owing to the bad weather and shortage of help. He also stated that there was a shortage of poles and suggested cooperating with the Telehone company in sending out men to cut a supply.

Chief of police reported the jail now in good condition.

Fire Chief Yoder reported alarms in pecember and in reporting for the year stated that various inspections of property had been made and in most cases, bad conditions had been cleared up.

As to fire losses in the City during the year -estimated value of property involved \$38200. With losses of \$2010.00. In the rural districts-property value involved \$42396.00 with losses of \$14731.00 Chief Yoder furthermore expressed a wish that the City would increase the allowance of \$10.00 per month now allocated to the pepartment.

Whereupon at this point, it was moved by Cutsforth, seconded by Krueger and carried, that the allowance be increased to \$20.00 per month.

## weeting of January 7 continued

City Treasurer Mang , then read his last quart ly report and annual report for 1945, the same being accepted subjected to the audit and approval of the Finance Committee.

Councilman Koehler of the Streets and Public property committee reported various streets having been re-surfaced; suggested that rules should be passed regulating heighth of tree branches over streets and sidewalks. Also stated that he had ordered new stop signs and insisted that a stop light was badly needed at the intersection of the Patific Highway and Molalla Avenue, instead of the warning flash now in use. It was then moved by Reynolds, seconded by Cutsforth and carried, that acceptance be made of the offer by the Oregon State Highway Commission to resurface the atreets through the City used by the locating trucks

to resurface the streets through the City used by the logging trucks, the City to pay 10% of the cost or approximately 600.00.

It was then stated that the Public Librarian had asked that the Council grant permission for a small "Library " sign to be placed on the outside of the City Hall and on motion, seconded and carried, this was granted.

Whereupon on motion of Dedman, seconded by Cutsforth and carried, the Council voted unanimously to concur with the action of the Fire pept. in electing Clayton Yoder as Fire Chief for 1946.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
