

Regular Monthly Meeting  
City Council of Canby  
Monday, March 4-1946

The regular monthly meeting of the City Council was held on Monday, March 4 and called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Before the meeting was called to order, Albert Berg was sworn into office, having been appointed by Mayor Vinyard to fill out the unexpired term of Craig Dedman, resigned.

## Reports

Fire Chief Yoder reported five calls in the previous month, with about \$500.00 damage to the Rueck property. No information regarding the installing of fire alarms contemplated.

Caretaker Galbraith asked for use of 12 acres of land, being a part of the Cemetery property, and now leased to Elwood Faist.

On motion of Koehler, seconded by Outsforth and carried, it was voted to notify Faist that his lease could not be renewed after this year.

Supt. Lent reported that a safe could be purchased from Bates Bros. for \$125.00 and on motion of Koehler, seconded by Stefani and carried, it was so ordered.

He also stated that it would be necessary to order four more transformers and more poles. very difficult to get wire. Pole and pipe lines about to be started through alley adjoining Oliver and Yakin property.

Councilman Koehler of the Streets and P.P. Com. asked for authority to grade Third street from Juniper to Knott and other streets nearby.

No objection. Also stated that he planned to oil 4th. St. from Grant 3 blocks west, 2 blocks near Catholic Church and two blocks on Juniper street, if possible.

Mayor Vinyard appointed Councilman Berg on the following committees; Health and Police-Park-and Fire and Water.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
