

Regular Monthly Meeting  
City Council  
Monday, May 6, 1946

The regular monthly meeting of the City Council was held on Monday, May 6 and called to order at the usual time.

On roll call there were present: Mayor Vinyard, Chief of Police Kendall , Recorder Evans and Councilmen Berg, Porter, Koehler, Kraft, Krueger and Reynolds. Absent-Cutsforth and Stefani.

The minutes of the previous meeting (regular) of April 1- and those of the special meetings of April 15 and 16 were read and approved.

## Communications.

The Recorder read a letter from the State Highway Commission in which it was stated that it was not deemed advisable to act favorably on the request for a "Stop and Go" sign at the intersection of the Pacific Highway and Molalla Avenue.

A communication from the League of Oregon Cities was also read. This was relative to the amended Budget law.

Reports

Supt. Lent reported most of the new 10" pipe having been installed, but not covered at the time. Several cave-ins while being laid and leaks to stop.

Also stated that we were all out of meters and transformers, with no immediate prospect of getting any.

Also that there were several residents just outside the city limits asking for water service, but that there was not enough pipe to serve others who were within.

Fire Chief reported several calls where no damage resulted and one to the Yost farm with damage of about \$ 800 with small insurance; also call to the Soallon place where the loss was estimated at about \$ 3500, insurance unknown.

The matter of attending the fire school at Seaside was then brought up, Yoder stating that 6 or 8 of the boys planned to go and asked what part of their expenses could be allowed.

It was then moved, seconded and carried that the sum of \$ 125 be allowed for this purpose.

Caretaker Galbraith reported that 3½ sections at the Cemetery had been surveyed and staked off and asked for lights for the office and repairs for the lawn mower. Left to Committee.

Councilman Koehler reported in the matter of log hauling to the Makin mill, stating that the trucks wanted to use Third street.

It was then moved, seconded and carried that they be instructed to use the Pacific Highway from the bus depot corner, turning right at Elm street and then left on First.

Whereupon the matter of garbage disposal and care of the city dump was introduced and Bob Torgeson offered to put dump in shape and build a fence for \$ 100.00, it being understood that a franchise would be granted him later.

On motion, seconded and carried it was voted to authorize him to proceed as above mentioned.

Budget Committee

Mayor Vinyard stating that at this time it would be necessary to appoint a Budget Committee to prepare a budget for the year from July 1-1946 to June 30-1947 named the following:

to meet at 8 o'clock P.M. on Thursday, May 16-1946

It was then moved by Krueger, seconded by Berg that the Com. on Streets and P.P. be authorized to purchase, if it appeared satisfactory, the Ford truck now at the Eversole Motors place of business, the same to be use for road purposes.

On roll call- unanimously in favor-Berg, Koehler, Kraft, Krueger and Reynolds.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
