

Regular Monthly Meeting
City Council of Canby, Oregon
Tuesday, Sept. 4-1945

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Tuesday Sept. 4, the previous Monday being a holiday.

The meeting was called to order at 8.15 P.M. by Mayor Vinyard and those answering roll call were-Mayor Vinyard, Chief of Police Kendall, Recorder Evans and Councilmen Dedman, Koehler, Kraft, Porter, Krueger and Stefani. Councilman Reynolds appeared later and Cutsforth was absent.

The minutes of the previous meeting of August 6 were read and approved.

It then appearing that there were present several applicants for the position of caretaker for the Cemetery, it was decided to first dispose of that matter.

The following applicants-F.R.Galbraith, Warren C. Kent and G.J. Welch, after some questioning were asked to retire while the members were reaching a decision. A written ballot was then taken, which resulted in 6 votes favorable to Galbraith and one for Kent.

Mr. Galbraith was then notified of his selection to serve at the will of the Council and as long as his work was satisfactory.

Whereupon Councilman Reynolds suggested donating the Sorenson lot to the family on account of his past services, but Attorney Zimmerman was of the opinion that it could not be legally done.

Reports

Supt. Lent reported that he had started digging the ditch to the Weygandt dryer, but finding that it was costing over \$ 6.00 per rod, decided the cost was excessive and quit. Had again contacted Joe Fisher, who had agreed to look it over.

Chairman Krueger of the Finance Com. stated that nothing had been heard from Don Bauer in regard to auditing. Recorder told to drop him a line.

Councilman Koehler of the Road Com. bro't up the matter of drainage, stating that during the recent rains, people had been complaining of pools of water in front of their property and not properly drained off.

Stated that before anything could be done to correct such a condition, levels should be run by a surveyor.

In this connection it was moved by Dedman, seconded and carried that Ralph Milne be asked to attend the next meeting for the purpose of discussing drainage and sidewalk levels.

Councilman Dedman for Health and Police reported having contacted the So. Pacific Co. relative to the dumping of refuse from their cars and stated that they had made other arrangements.

Also suggested that the City should have a day policeman and that auto speeding and bicycle riding should be checked.

In this connection, it was decided to place an adv. in the Canby Herald for a "Utility man" who would also serve as day police.

Mayor Vinyard then bro't up the matter of having a city census taken under the new 1945 Act of Legislature and the recorder was instructed to write the proper State Dept.

It then developed that the change of names of the city streets made several years ago had never been made a matter of record, and the Recorder was asked to record a copy of the ordinance covering same.

Ordinance

Ordinance No. 341 authorizing the purchase and installation of radio equipment for the fire truck, the cost not to exceed \$ 440. was introduced and passed on it's first reading and ordered published and to come up for final action at the next regular meeting of the Council.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.

Special Meeting Thursday, Sept. 20-1945

A special meeting of the Council was held on Thursday, Sept. 20 1945 and called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present and answering roll call were-Mayor Vinyard, Recorder Evans and Councilmen Cutsforth-Dedman-Koehler-Kraft and Porter.

Mayor Vinyard announced that the meeting had been called for the purpose of considering the applications for the position of a "Utility man". After considerable discussion, on motion of Porter, seconded by Kraft, it was voted unanimously to secure the services of Marion Garmire at a salary of \$ 150.00 per month and it being the understanding that he was prepared to take up his duties at once.

Whereupon the matter of having a census of the City taken was then bro't up and it appearing necessary to make a proper application to the Secretary of State, the following resolution was introduced and passed. Yeas 5-Nays 0 .

RESOLUTION

RESOLVED-THAT pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 122, Oregon Laws 1945, the Common Council of the City of Canby, Oregon does hereby request the Secretary of State to make an enumeration of the inhabitants of this City, the expenses thereof to be paid by the City.
