

Regular Monthly Meeting  
City Council of Canby, Oregon  
Monday, Octo. 1-1945

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Monday, October 1, 1945 and called to order at 8 o'clock P.M.

Those answering roll call were: Councilmen Dedman, Cutsforth, Porter, Reynolds, Krueger and Stefani. Chief of Police Kendal and Recorder Evans. ~~Atty. General~~

In the absence of Mayor Vinyard and President of the council Koehler, Councilman Porter presided.

The minutes of the last regular meeting and those of the special meeting of September 20 were read and approved.

#### Communications

A letter from Don Bauer was read, in which he stated that he would not be able at this time to take on the audit of the City books, but could probably do so about the first of the year, unless the City should make other arrangements in the meantime.

Also a communication from Jerry Sayler relative to the "Retirement Pension Plan" stating that full details would be forwarded later.

Letter from Geo. Nelson asking if something could not be done to correct radio interference in Canby.

Communication from Curtis Johnson relative to proposed "Living War Memorial" for Canby and meeting to be held on Oct. 10th. in High School auditorium.

Whereupon Ralph Miln being present, on invitation was asked for advice relative to establishment of levels for sidewalks and drainage. He stated that he would recommend first a complete map of the city, and suggested that a committee be appointed to decide just what was wanted; and that he would be glad to work with such committee.

It was then moved by Dedman, seconded by Cutsforth and carried, that such a committee be appointed, consisting of Geo. Koehler, Louis Lent and one other to be named by Koehler.

It then appearing that Ordinance No. 326 changing the names of the city streets had not been drawn to comply with the original plat of Canby, it was moved by pedman, seconded by Reynolds and carried, that this Ordinance be revamped by Attorney Zimmerman, with the aid of Mr. Miln.

#### Reports

Mr. Lent reported that the ditch to the Weygandt nut dryer had been completed at a cost of \$ 125.00.

Also stated that Marion Carmire's work so far had been very satisfactory.

It was then moved by Reynolds, seconded by Cutsforth and carried that the Recorder write Dr. Haver of the Bonneville Plant that Canby would appreciate having the use of radio ~~xx~~-interference detector to clear up trouble in the city.

City Treasurer Mangus then read his report for the quarter ending Sept. 30, which was accepted by the Council, subject to audit by the Finance Committee.

Whereupon in the matter of the Living War Memorial for Canby, the following committee was appointed by the chair:

Mayor Vinyard, Councilmen Cutsforth, Stefani, Kraft, Reynolds, and Porter.

Attorney Zimmerman then bro't up the subject of the necessity of revising the city charter and suggested that a committee be appointed to take up the matter with the League of Oregon Cities.

Ordinance No. 341 , providing for payment for radio equipment for fire truck came up for final action and was duly passed.  
Yeas 5-nays none.

No other business appearing the meeting adjourned.
