Communications

A letter from the Secretary of State was read, in which was enclosed his official certificate as to the recent census taken in Canby and establishing the count at 1236.

On motion by Cutsforth, seconded and carried, it was voted to pay those taking the census at the rate of 10c per name.

Reports

Supt. Lent reported having gone over the lines relative to the radio interference, but was unsuccessful in locating anything that could be the cause. Also stated that a Fonneville man had been here in response to letter sent their office and who indicated that they would be glad to furnish some assistance in the matter, when possible.

Wr. Lent also reported that on Halloween and since, about 50 lights

had been destroyed by persons unknown. Thereupon on motion by Koehler, seconded by Krueger and carried, it was voted to display rosters offering a reward of # 25.00 for information leading to the identity of the persons destroying city property.

Whereupon ensued a scussion regarding the preent poor lighting in the City and Mayor Vinyard suggested larger wast bulbs in thex business district.

It was then moved by Reynolds, seconded by Dedman and carried, that thirty lights be changed from the present wattage to 200 watt lights.

Feferring to the matter of a new charter for the city, the Recordery was instructed to write the "League of Oregon Cities" for a sample form.

The matter of the care of Cemetery lots was then bro't up and on motion of Reynolds, seconded by Dedman and carried it was decided that the caretaker should turn over to the City all moneys collected, he to be reimbursed quarterly.

It then appearing that the dwelling occupied by the caretaker of the Cemetery was badly in need of a coat of paint, on motion of Koehler, seconded by Cutsforth and carried, it was voted that the necessary paint

be purchased for Mr. Galbraith, who agreed to see that it was applied. Chief of Police then reported that a new lock was needed for the jail, also some blankets. He was told to buy the lock and use blankets which had been purchased for the firemen, but no longer needed by them.

The Finance Committee then reported having audited the Treasurer's

report for the quarter ending Sept. 30 and found it correct.
Chairman Koehler of the Street Committee reported that in many places tree branches extended over the street and interfering with operation of the road equipment and asked for opinions in the matter.

Mayor Vinyard suggested cooperating with owners as much as possible,

but if not successful, thought the Council should take action.

Mr. Koehler also reported bthat his committee had met with Ralph Miln relative to the establishment of grades and levels; Miln's charge would be # 20.00 per day. Could not estimate what it would cost the City, but would want to do a complete job.

It was then moved by Stefani, seconded by Reynolds and carried, that Mr. Miln be employed for the work, as previously mentioned, especially for the platted part of the City and any other streets or districts that the Street Committee and Mr. Lent thought necessary.

It was then moved by Koehler, seconded by Cutsforth and carried that Supt. Lent be instructed to purchase an emery wheel for the pur-

pose of sharpening tools. Whereupon it appearing advisable to have a health officer, this position having been vacant for sometime, Mayor Vinyard appointed Dr. pinsmore, who had formerly served as such.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
