

Regular Meeting
February 5, 1945

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held Monday Feb. 5th 8 o'clock P.M. Councilman Cutsforth not being present at the January meeting was sworn in. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Chief of Police Kendall, Recorder Mangus and Councilmen Cutsforth, Dedman, Koehler, Kraft, Krueger, Porter, Reynolds and Stefani. Absent Atty. Zimmerman.

Minutes of the January meeting were read and approved.

City Treasurer Eid read his report for the fourth quarter of 1944, also annual report covering the year 1944. Treasurers report was accepted subject to audit of the Finance Committee.

A communication from the Telephone Co., suggesting that the Police signal light be moved to the intersection of Main and Grant Sts., was read.

On motion, seconded and carried the above claims were ordered paid. Yeas 8, nays 0.

Chief of Police Kendall reported that the Cess-pool cleaners had paid a fine for dumping at the City Dump. Mayor Vinyard stated that they had requested permission to dump there, but that he had not given them an answer. Was agreed by the Council that dumping there would not be permitted.

Fire Chief Yoder gave a report of the Departments activities for the month, also read a Rural Fire Dept. Report for the year 1944. Requested that better lighting and some outlets be provided in the Fire Station. Motion was made, seconded and carried that additional lights and outlets be installed in the Fire Station, also that the walls be painted a light color.

Mr. Lent reported that the Oil Companies power line extension would be started the next day. Also stated that three new transformers would be needed.

Councilman Koehler gave a report on the street work for the year 1944. He stated that the delinquent taxes on the Park property should be paid. Motion was made and seconded that these taxes be paid. On vote of the Council, motion passed. Yeas 8, nays 0.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the City request the County Court to dedicate the County owned property at the end of Knott St., as a City Street.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that a bulldozer be engaged to level the ground at the Cemetery, also to be used at the City Dump. The matter of putting in crops on the Park property was left with the Park Committee.

Councilman Koehler stated that the new building being constructed by the Stefani Lumber Co., is 10 feet in the City Street. Councilman Dedman stated that there were other cases about town where the fences or buildings were outside of the property line and into the street. He recommended that all property in town be checked and that trespassers be notified. No action was taken by the Council at this time.

Councilman Dedman suggested that the dog ordinance be published and that Police Officers take action against dogs running at large. He also stated that Ben Hansen would like to have his old job back with the City. Was agreed that there is no vacancy.

Mayor Vinyard announced that a new Recorder would have to be selected and nominated Ralph C.Zimmerman for the position.On vote of the Council Ralph C.Zimmerman was elected City Recorder.

Councilman Cutsforth suggested that some provision should be made for public toilets by the City.After some discussion Mayor Vinyard was instructed to see what arrangements could be made for a location for public toilets.

Mayor Vinyard announced Committee's as follows,first person named on each committee to act as Chairman.
