

REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING  
CITY COUNCIL OF CANBY, OREGON,  
MARCH 5, 1945.

The regular monthly meeting of the City Council of Canby was held Monday evening March 5, 1945, at 8:00 o'clock P.M. The meeting was called to order by Mayor J.R. Vinyard, and roll call of the members had, and there were present, Mayor Vinyard, Chief of Police Kendall, Recorder Ralph C. Zimmerman, Councilmen Cutsforth, Dedman, Koehler, Kraft, Krueger, Porter, Reynolds and Stefani. After the reading of the minutes of the February 5, 1945 Council meeting, the same were approved as read. On vote of the Council the above claims were ordered paid. Yeas 8 Nays 0. A.W. Thompson having resigned as Special Police Officer, James F. Hudson was sworn in as such officer.

The Mayor then called on all the different chairmen of the various committees. E.A. Krueger of the Finance Committee reported that the report of the City Treasurer was O.K. C.C. Dedman chairman of the Health and Police Committee reported that since ~~A.W. Thompson~~ resigned as a special police officer, that James F. Hudson be sworn in as such officer, and James F. There were no reports from any other committees, except that the cemetery is now being levelled off wherever needed.

No further business coming before the Council, on motion made and seconded the Council adjourned.
