The regular monthly meeting of the City Council was held Monday evening April 2, 1945, at 8:00 O'clock. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Vinyard and roll call had of the members present and those who answered the roll call were; Mayor Vinyard, Chief of Police Kendall, Recorded Zimmerman, Councilmen, Dedman, Koehler, Kraft, Krueger, Porter, and Stefani. Absent Councilmen Cutsforth and Reynolds.

The reading of the minutes of the March 5, 1945, regular meeting was then had, and after the reading of said minutes, Councilman Dedman moved for a correction in substituting the name of Clayton Yoder to that of A.W.Thompson, as the resigned special police officer. Said minutes are corrected accordingly, after which they were approved.

Claims against the City were then called for, and after examination of same by the members of the council, the claim of Clackamas County was order held up, for the reason that the charges for use of the bull dozer were supposed to be \$7.00 per hour instead of \$9.00 per hour as charged. Claim was to be paid after adjustment, and Councilman Geo. Koehler had said claim adjusted to read \$273.00 as due Clackamas County, instead of \$378.00 the amount of the original bill.

City Treasurer John Eid read his report for the quarter of 1945 ending March 31. Moved and seconded that the report be accepted, subject to the audit of the finance committee. Carried.

It was moved and seconded to transfer \$500.00 out of the Cemetery Fund into the Sinking Fund. Carried.

Fire Chief Clayton Yoder gave a report on fires, as follows; Commercial Hotel, filue, Barlow Filue; Bill Melum Flue, Jack Fisher Flue and E.G. Brown Flue. Also that the Mayor and the Committees on Fire and Water attend a meeting to be held in Oregon City, April 16, for the

purpose of providing for better communications between cities of fire trucks and police on account of the danger of jap balloon bombs. Also that the Committee on streets check the alleys in Canby on account of holes in the alley streets.

It was moved and seconded and carried, that the flag pole at the cemetery be repainted and placed on hinges so it can be more easily taken down and raised again. Cometery committee authorized to take charge and attend to these matters.

No further business appearing before the Council, moved and seconded to affjourn.
