

REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL
OF CANBY, OREGON, May 7, 1945.

The regular monthly meeting of the City Council was held on Monday evening May 7, 1945, at 8:00 o'clock. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Vinyard and roll call had of the members present. Those answering the roll call were, Mayor Vinyard, Chief of Police Kendall, Recorder Zimmerman, Councilmen Cutsforth, Dedman, Krueger, Porter, Reynolds and Stefani. Absent Koehler and Kraft.

Reading of the minutes of the regular meeting for April was then had. Same were approved as read.

The correspondence consisted of a letter from the State Corporation Commissioner, asking for the appointment of an Attorney in Fact of the Zion Cemetery. Said corporation having been absorbed by the City of Canby, the Recorder was instructed to inform the Corporation Commissioner accordingly. Letter from State Highway Commission relative to allocations of funds was not acted upon.

On motion made and seconded, above claims be ordered paid. Yeas 6 Nays 0. Carried.

Fire Chief Clayton Yoder gave a report of the damage done to the home of Jack Gribble, of about \$400.00, by a fire which the Canby Fire Department quenched.

The matter of a pickup truck was brought to the attention of the Council by Light & Water Superintendent Louis Lent. It was moved, seconded and carried that application of priority be made and sent in for the purchase of such truck.

Chairman Krueger of the Finance Committee, reported that the Treasurer's quarterly report was accepted and favorably passed on.

Chairman Dedman/of the Health and Police Committee, reported that he took up with the State Police the matter of the wild driving on the streets of Canby, by some of the highschool lads.

M.J. Lee was present at the Council meeting, and upon invitation of Mayor Vinyard, Mr. Lee stated that he was present in behalf of some of the pioneers buried in the Baker-Prairie Cemetery. It was moved, seconded and carried that the Mayor appoint a committee of three to investigate the affairs relating to that cemetery. The Mayor appointed C.C. Dedman, Geo. Koehler and R.J. Reynolds as such committee. Moved, seconded and carried that the City appropriate the sum of \$25.00 towards helping cleaning up said cemetery prior to Decoration Day, and that M.J. Lee shall see that the work is carried out.

With the approval of the City Council, Mayor Vinyard, designated May 17th, 1945, as City clean-up day.

OVER.

The matter of appointing the Budget Committee to fix the 1945-46 budget for the City of Canby came on for attention, and Mayor Winyard, with the approval of the Council appointed the following Committee, to-wit: George Catley, Peter Kylio, Clayton Yoder, Carl Lucke, George Berg, Wilmer Sandness, Carl Ellingsen and E.O. Mueller, to meet May 16, 8 P.M.

The matter of a City Recorder coming up, it was moved, seconded and carried that the salary of the City Recorder shall be \$25.00 per month, retroactive to March 1, 1945. It was further moved, seconded and carried that Harry Evans be appointed as City Recorder, and that he be contacted as to his acceptance of this position by Councilman Dedman, or Porter.

Councilman Porter gave a report of the meeting held in Oregon on April 16th. And altho this meeting had somewhat to do with the Jap balloons coming into our territory with incendiary and explosive bombs, yet the main importance of said meeting was for closer and more co-operation between the various neighborhood cities in fire protective measures, and to be of more, better and quicker help to each other in the event of serious fires, and for that purpose it would be necessary for the different fire trucks to be equipped with radio. That a radio set for such purpose would cost about \$450.00 and the installation about \$45.00, or a total of somewhere around \$500.00 per set. That the Oregon City Fire Department would assist in obtaining these radio sets and would assist in installing them, and would also assist in obtaining priorities. Moved, seconded and carried, that application for priority to purchase radio equipment for Canby, Fire Department. This report was further augmented by Fire Chief Clayton Yoder.

There being no further business, upon motion made to adjourn, seconded and carried the Council adjourned.
