

Regular Monthly Meeting
City Council of Canby, Oregon
July 2, 1945

The regular monthly meeting of the City Council was held on Monday, July 2, 1945 and called to order at 8.15 P.M. by Mayor Vinyard.

On roll call, those answering were- Mayor Vinyard, Chief of Police Kendall, Recorder H.B.Evans and Councilmen Cutsforth, Koehler, Kraft, Krueger, Porter and Stefani. Absent-Dedman and Reynolds.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of June 4 and those of the special meeting of June 19 were then read and approved.

Communications

A letter from Harvey Everhart relative to a refund from the Cemetery Fund to Mrs. Wetherbee was presented in which it was suggested that she was entitled to a return of \$ 49.50 having been paid for " perpetual care".

Also letter from the State Highway Commission with reference to the need of repairs for Canby streets ruined by logging trucks; also letter with reference to proposed street work for 1945.

With regard to the first communication, Mayor Vinyard stated that he had talked with Mr. Stromyer, who would investigate the matter.

Whereupon, Mr. M.A.Larson being present asked the Council as to the possibility of opening Knott street to Cemetery Road.

The Mayor announced that if the various owners of the property involved were prepared to deed to the City, the street could no doubt be extended. Councilman Porter then moved, seconded by Cutsforth that the City accept the extension after a proper survey. Carried.

Mr. E. O. Mueller then asked that the grass adjacent to the city dump be fired at once by the department, as it constituted a hazard.

Quarterly report of City Treasurer

City Treasurer did stated that owing to the fact that the meeting came so early in the month he could not render a complete report, but submitted the following figures for the quarter ending June 30-1945

It was then moved by Porter, seconded by Stefani and carried, that \$ 5000 from the Light Fund and \$ 2500 from the water Fund be used for the purpose of buying 7500 U.S. Gov't bonds.

Whereupon Supt. Lent reported plenty of work in sight and stated that he would need 880' of 4 inch pipe, couplings and valve to extend water service to the Weygandt nut dryer and that Weygandt would furnish part of the labor.

On motion by Koehler, seconded by Gutsforth and carried, the above mentioned extension was allowed.

On motion of Koehler, seconded by Krueger and carried, it was voted that order for pickup be placed details left to the Light and Water committee.

The Recorder was also instructed to write for priority to purchase a dump truck.

Fire Chief Clayton Yoder then reported the following fire calls:

June 13 - Bond place on the Meridian Road-some damage, covered by insurance.

June 27-M.C.Burk, Nedy-no damage.

June 28-Call to city dump.

July 2 -Tom Bugins brooder house-slight roof damage.

He also stated that the grass adjacent to city dump was about ready to burn.

It was then moved by Porter seconded by Gutsforth and carried that the City purchase radio equipment for 2 fire truck.

Whereupon on motion by Porter seconded by Gutsforth, the Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant for \$ 49.50 in favor of Mrs. Wetherbee, returning to her the payment made for perpetual care of lot in cemetery.

Ordinance # 340 levying a tax on all taxable property within the city limits of Canby then came up for final action and on vote of Council was passed. Yeas 5-Nays 0.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
