

Special Meeting
City Council of Canby
Monday, July 9-1945

A special meeting of the Council was held on Monday, July 9, 1945 and called to order at 8.30 P. M. by Mayor Vinyard.

Those answering to roll call were-Mayor Vinyard, Recorder H.B.Evans and Councilmen Cutsforth, Dedman, Koehler, Kraft, Krueger, Porter, Reynolds and Stefani.

Whereupon the resignation of John Eid as City Treasurer was presented and read. On motion of Koehler, seconded by Cutsforth and carried, his resignation was accepted.

Mayor Vinyard then announced that the meeting had been called for the purpose of appointing a person to fill this position now vacated.

On motion of Porter, seconded by Reynolds and carried, the Mayor then named Roy Mangus to serve as temporary City Treasurer until a permanent one should be appointed.

It was then moved by Porter, seconded by Stefani and carried, that the Finance Committee secure the services of a competent auditor and have the Treasurer's books audited.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.

Regular Monthly Meeting
City Council of Canby, Oregon
Monday, August 6, 1945

The regular monthly meeting of the City Council was held on Monday, August 6, 1945 and called to order at 8.25 P. M.

Those answering roll call were, Mayor Vinyard, Chief of Police Kendall, Recorder Evans and Councilmen Dedman, Koehler, Kraft, Porter, Reynolds and Stefani. Absent Cutsforth and Krueger.

The minutes of the previous meeting of July 2 and those of the special meeting of July 9 were read and approved.

Communications

Under this head, a letter from the P.G.E. was read, stating that in the future their Oregon City office would handle business heretofore cared for by the Aurora office.

Also letter from the Federal Communications Commission relative to the truck radio. (Turned over to Fire Chief)

Whereupon Mr. Ralph Milne, County Surveyor being present, asked the Council to accept the opening of certain streets, namely 2nd. St and Juniper, as evidenced by deeds from Lorin Fish and wife, G.G. Makin and wife and "Makin and wife and Myrtle C. Crosson.

It was moved by Koehler seconded by Reynolds and carried that these extensions be accepted and the three deeds be placed of record.

Mr. Milne also suggested that the City obtain a quit-claim deed from O.R.Mack covering certain property.

Reports

Supt. Lent reported that more water had been pumped in July than ever before. Stated that he had contacted Joe Fisher relative to digging the trench for pipe line to the Weygandt nut dryer; also still out of water meters; also suggested that common labor should be raised to \$ 1.00 per hour.

In this connection it was moved by Stefani, seconded by Reynolds that common labor should be paid .85c per hour. Carried.

Also mentioned that apparently some gasoline had been illegally taken from fire truck.

Mr. Koehler of the Street Com. reported work done on the Cemetery Road-4th. street-5th. street-South 2nd. Ave.-Third Ave. and Elm Street. Also stated that portion of Knott Street should be dedicated to the City by the County.

Councilman Dedman reported that the city dump was a mess and Mayor Vinyard stated that complaints had been made relative to the unloading of decayed fruit in the pit from S.P. cars.

Councilman Reynolds reported having contacted Jess Hepler in connection with the position of caretaker at the Cemetery., but that Elmer Zeek would fill in until a permanent appointment had been made.
