

Regular Meeting.
October 2, 1944

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held Monday October 2nd. 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Atty. Zimmerman, Recorder Mangus and Councilmen Cutsforth, Everhart, Koehler, Porter and Reynolds. Councilmen Dedman and Stefani reported later. Mayor Vinyard and Councilman Krueger, absent. On motion, seconded and carried the above claims were ordered paid. Yeas 7, Nays 0.

Mr. Lent called the Council's attention to the fact that the Latourette property was to be layed out into lots and suggested that provision should be made for alleys through this property. Motion was made, seconded and carried that a Committee of three, consisting of Koehler, Lent and Stefani be appointed to discuss the matter of alleys through the Latourette property, with the owners.

Mr. Koehler gave a report of street work that had been completed.

Atty. Zimmerman stated that an inquire/ should be made of the Tax Comm. regarding the Southern Pacific Co. delinquent taxes. The Recorder was instructed to address a letter to the Tax Commission requesting information on these taxes.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the City pay 75c per hour for common labor.

There being no further business, on motion the Council adjourned.
