RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, on December 26, 1941 the City of Canby, Oregon, did enter into a certain contract of agreement with Ray-Mailing Company, Inc., a corporation of the State of Oregon, wherein said City of Canby, Oregon, does furnish to said Ray-Mailing Company, Inc., certain electric energy for the operation of the pea vining station situated south of said Canby, Oregon where Road numbered 562 intersects with Market Road No. 10, which said contract is for a term of five seasons, or years from the date thereof; and

WHEREAS, it appears from certain correspondence received from said Ray-Mailing Company, Inc., that said company has now sold all its interests in its business to General Foods Corporation, and desire the right from said City of Canby, Oregon, to assign and transfer this certain contract to said General Foods Corporation; and

WHEREAS, at the regular monthly meeting of the City Council of the City of Canby, Oregon, on October 4, 1943, ^{they} were sufficiently advised in this matter, and it appearing to the members of said City Council that the assignment and transfer of this contract should be allowed to be made by said Ray-Mailing Company, Inc., to said General Foods Corporation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the City Council of the City of Canby, Oregon, does hereby authorize ~~to~~ ^{the} assignment and transfer of said contract by Ray-Mailing Company, Inc., to said General Foods Corporation, for the remainder of the term of seasons, or years, as therein set forth, with the same conditions, promises and agreements therein contained, to be as binding upon the said General Foods Corporation, as on said Ray-Mailing Company, Inc.,
