

Regular Meeting.
January 5, 1942.

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held Monday January 5th., 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Atty. Zimmerman, Chief of Police Hansen, Recorder Mangus and Councilmen Cutsforth, Evehart, Koehler, Pfister, Porter, Reynolds and Stefani. Councilman Gesik absent.

Minutes of the regular December meeting and special meeting of December 15th., were read and approved.

A letter from the Volunteer Fire Dept. stating that Fred Stefani had been elected as Chief of the Department was read by the Recorder also an application for a retail beer license by Elmer Knudson. Motion was made, seconded and carried that the beer license application of Elmer Knudson be approved. Before considering the matter of approving the election Fred Stefani as Fire Chief, the question of whether he can hold the office of fire chief and at the same time serve as a member of the City Council was referred to the City Attorney for an opinion.

Mr. Hallihan addressed the council regarding the operation of pin-ball machines within the city limits of Canby. After discussion motion was made & seconded that this matter be left on the table for future consideration.

Mr. Lent gave a report of the flow of water from the springs, also a summary of the light & water dept. activities for the year 1941.

Fire Chief Kraft gave his report of the fire dept. activities for the year 1941, also thanked the Council for their co-operation during the time he has served as Fire Chief. By motion the Recorder was instructed to write the fire department, thanking them for their efforts during the past year.

Mr. Koehler gave a report of street work done during the past year.

Ordinance # 334, Relating to National Defense and providing for observance of black-outs and other restrictions was passed on first reading.

Motion was made, seconded and on vote of the Council was passed, Yeas 7, Nays 0, that \$10,000.00 of City funds be invested in United States Defense Bonds. The Finance Committee and the City Attorney was instructed to select the type of bond or bonds to purchase.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that ten Indian Fire Fighters be purchased by the City.

The Chief of Police was instructed to secure a location and have the old bell-tower and bell erected to serve as a warning signal.

There being no further business, on motion the Council adjourned.
