April 6, 1942.

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held Monday April 6th., 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Atty. On motion the above claims were ordered paid. Yeas 6, Nays 0.

Mr. Lent reported that the electric line to the pea-viner had been completed. Also that a drive pulley had been ordered for the well pump.

Members of the Council decided to inspect the test well at the springs Tuesday the 7th. of April.

Fire Chief Stefani reported that the department answered three calls during the month, no damage. That the auxiliary firemen training course was under way. Also requested the City to help financially toward the purchase of Firemen's Helmets. Motion was made, seconded and carried that \$25.00 be contributed toward the purchase of firemen's helmets.

Councilman Porter reported that a stock pile of sand was located at the back of the City Hall.

City Treasurer John Eid read his report for the first quarter of 1942. Motion was made, seconded and carried that the Treasurer's report be accepted, subject to audit of the Finance Committee.

Councilman Koehler reported that he had been unable to do any patching work on the streets as yet.

Mr. Lent recommended to the Council that Francis Skinner be paid \$1.25 per hour for line work. On motion, seconded and carried the Mr. Lents recommendation was approved.

After approval by the Council, Mayor Vinyard announced the Budget Committee as follows: W.H. Thompson, Wilmer Sandsness, George Cattley, E.A. Krueger, John Koehler, Peter Kylo, W.A. Meek and Charles Harshman.

There being no further business, on motion the Council adjourned.
