May 4, 1942.

Following the discussion of dog poisoning about town motion was made, seconded and carried that a Reward of \$25.00 be offered for the conviction of anyone putting out poison illegally.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the Volunteer Fire Dept. be allowed \$75.00 to be used by the members toward Convention expenses at Baker.

There being no further business on motion the Council adjourned.
