

Regular Meeting July 6, 1942.

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held Monday July 6th. 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Atty. Zimmerman, Chief of Police Hansen, Recorder Mangus and Councilmen Cutsforth, Everhart, Gesik, Koehler, Reynolds and Stefani. Councilmen Pfister and Porter absent.

On motion, seconded and carried the above claims were allowed.
Yeas 5, nays 0.

Mr. Lent recommended that regulations for the use of water during the months of July and August be put into effect. On motion, seconded and carried the Council approved a Proclamation issued by Mayor Vinyard regulation the use of water during the months of July and August. A Copy of this proclamation being a part of these minutes.

On motion, seconded and carried the Council approved the drawing of a Warrant for \$180.00 for wood, payment to be made when wood is ready for delivery.

Fire Chief Stefani was authorized to arrange for gasoline storage so that gasoline will be available for the fire department equipment at all times.

City Treasurer John Eid read his report for the second quarter. Report was received subject to audit of the Finance Committee.

Mr. Koehler reported that the cost of street oiling was about double what it was a year ago. He was authorized by the Council to have the necessary work done that he is able to get materials and labor to do with

Councilman Gesik recommended that the pay increase of the Chief of Police and Nightwatchman be granted as of May 1, 1942. On motion, seconded and carried and additional \$10.00 per month for the months of May and June was approved for payment to the Chief of Police and the Nightwatchman.

Councilman Everhart reported that the Cemetery was without a Caretaker.

Ordinance #335 levying a tax on all the taxable property within the City limits of Canby came up for final action. On vote of the Council Ordinance #335 was passed yeas 5, nays 0.

There being no further business on motion the Council adjourned.

P R O C L A T I O N .

WHEREAS, the unregulated and uncontrolled use of City water for sprinkling purposes, in the City of Canby, during the months of JULY and AUGUST^{SEPT}, usually results in such a shortage of water which endangers the supply and the capacity of the City Water Works to pump sufficient water for all needs, and is in the judgement of the City Council of Canby, a menace to the safety of life and property in the event of any fires which might occur during these extremely dry months; and

WHEREAS, in the past it has been necessary that the City Council regulate and control the use of water during the months of JULY and AUGUST^{SEPT} of each year, for the reasons above stated;

NOW, THEREFORE, The City Council of the City of Canby, Oregon, does hereby proclaim that the unregulated and uncontrolled use of water for sprinkling purposes during the months of JULY and AUGUST^{SEPT}, 1942, shall be unlawful, and that the regulated and controlled use of City water for sprinkling purposes is hereby declared to be as follows;

For all residents on the Northerly side of the Southern Pacific Railroad tracts, the right to use such City water for sprinkling purposes shall be on the odd days of the months of July and August^{SEPT}, 1942.

For all residents on the Southerly side of said Souther Pacific Railroad tracts, the right to use City water for sprinkling purposes shall be on even days of the months of July and August^{SEPT}, 1942.

All such regulations shall be under the supervision of the Superintendent of the Canby Light & Water Department.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this Proclamation shall be subject to be prosecuted under the City Ordinances regulating such use of water for such purposes.

This Proclamation shall be effective during the months of JULY and AUGUST^{SEPT}, 1942.
