After dis ussion the Chief of Police was instructed to take all arrests to Mr.T.H.Arestad for hearing.

Ordinance #331 specifying the width of City streets dedicated or layed out within the city limits of Canby came up for final action.

On vote of the Council Ordinance #331 was passed. Yeas 7, nays 0. Lester Hess requested the Council to make some improvements on the house occupied by him at the Cemetery, estimated costs to be about \$224.00.0n motion the Cemetery Committee was instructed to report at the next meeting the cost of mecessary repairs and what additional income could be expected.

There being no frther business on motion the Council adjourned.
