

Regular Meeting.
October 6, 1941.

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held Monday Oct. 6th. 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Atty. Zimmerman, Chief of Police Hansen, Recorder Mangus and Councilmen Everhart, Koehler, Pfister, Porter, Reynolds and Stefani. Councilman Cutsforth reported later, Councilman Gesik absent.

Minutes of the September meeting were read and approved.

Several pin-ball machine Distributors being present, addressed the Council regarding the repeal of the Ordinance prohibiting the operation of of coin operated machines.

Mr. Lent reported that the test well did not produce a sufficient flow of water. Several new stoves and water heaters had been connected also more poles would be needed shortly. The means of obtaining more water was discussed. The matter of digging more test wells was left with the water committee. Mr. Lent recommended that City Employees pay be increased to the following rates, common labor .50 per hour, common climbing .62½ per hour, hot electric line work .87½ per hour. On motion, the above rates of pay for City employees was approved. Yeas 7, nays 0.

Councilman Stefani reported that four Volunteer Firemen attended the Firemen's Convention. Mayor Vinyard requested that the Fire Chief report to the Council on the Convention.

City Treasurer John Eid read his report for the third quarter of 1941. Motion was made, seconded and carried that the Treasurer's report be accepted, subject to audit of the Finance Committee.

After discussion, motion was made, seconded and carried that the Committee be authorized to have the necessary filling done in the parking strip around the park block.

After discussion the Chief of Police was instructed to take all arrests to Mr. T.H. Arestad for hearing.

Ordinance #331 specifying the width of City streets dedicated or layed out within the city limits of Canby came up for final action. On vote of the Council Ordinance #331 was passed. Yeas 7, nays 0.

Lester Hess requested the Council to make some improvements on the house occupied by him at the Cemetery, estimated costs to be about \$224.00. On motion the Cemetery Committee was instructed to report at the next meeting the cost of necessary repairs and what additional income could be expected.

There being no further business on motion the Council adjourned.
