

Regular Meeting.
November 3, 1941.

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held Monday Nov. 3rd., 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Atty. Zimmerman, Chief of Police Hansen, Recorder Mangus and Councilmen Cutsforth, Koehler, Pfister, Reynolds and Stefani. Councilman Gesik and Porter reported later. Councilman Everhart absent.

Communications from the State Fire Marshall, the Southern Pacific Co., St. Patricks Church and the State Industrial Accident Commission were read by the Recorder.

Mr. Bartlett a representative of the Southern Pacific Co. addressed the Council requesting that all logging trucks be required to stop before crossing the railroad tracks on Ivy St.

Mr. Frank Jayne addressed the Council requesting the use of the Council Chambers as a temporary meeting place for the Canby Post of the American Legion the second and fourth Wednesday nights of each month.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the Legion be granted permission to use the Council Chambers as a temporary meeting place.

On motion, seconded and carried the above claims were ordered paid. Yeas 7, nays 0.

Mr. Lent reported that some water was available from the springs on the Hylton property. On motion, seconded and carried the Water Comm. and Supt. was authorized to get an option on the property, file for water rights and any other preliminary work necessary to acquiring a new source of water.

On motion, seconded and carried Dr. F.C. Renfrew was appointed City Health Officer.

Ordinance #332, levying a tax on all the taxable property within the city limits of Canby came up for final action. On vote of the Council Ordinance #332 was passed. Yeas 7, nays 0.

Ordinance #333 vacating the alley-way thru block 17, so long as the property is used and occupied by the Catholic Diocese, was passed on first reading and ordered published.

The Recorder was instructed to notify Cemetery lot owners that perpetual care was now available.

There being no further business on motion the Council adjourned.
