

Special Meeting.
January 9th.1941.

A special meeting of the Council was held Thursday January 9th. 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Chief of Police Hansen, Recorder Mangus and Councilmen Koehler, Pfister, Porter, Reynolds and Stefani. Councilmen Cutsforth and Everhart reported later. Absent Atty. Zimmerman and Councilman Gesik. Also present was Mr. Fridley and several members of his class at the Canby Union High School.

Mayor Vinyard announced that the meeting was called to consider and adopt new names for the streets about town.

After considerable discussion Motion was made, seconded and carried that the first street at the western edge of town, be known as River Drive, and coming east each street be named in alphabetical order.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that alphabetical street names be adopted as selected. These are as follows: Cedar-Douglas-Elm-Fir-Grant-Holly-Ivy-Juniper-Knott and Locus.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that cross streets running east and west be numbered by avenues. Each side to be known as North and South.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the names of roads be accepted as designated by Councilman Koehler.

There being no further business on motion the Council adjourned.
