

Regular Meeting.  
February 3, 1941.

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held Monday Febry. 3rd., 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Atty. Zimmerman, Chief of Police Hansen, Recorder Mangus and Councilmen Cutsforth, Everhart, Gesik, Koehler, Pfister, Porter, Reynolds and Stefani.

Minutes of the regular January meeting and special meeting of January 9th., were read and approved.

Communications from Senator H.C. Belton, Fred C. Inkster and a letter from the W.P.A. regarding explosives purchased from J.R. Pitts, were read by the Recorder.

Mr. Anderson of the Bonneville Administration addressed the Council in regard to an industrial survey to be made in the Willamette valley.

On motion, seconded and carried the above claims were ordered paid. Yeas 8, Nays 0.

Mayor Vinyard announced the reappointment of Dr. E. A. Hendry as City Health Officer.

George Towner addressed the Council regarding the seeding of the City Park Lots. This matter was referred to the Committee.

Motion was made and seconded that a bill of \$9.90 from the J. R. Pitts, Estate be allowed. On vote of the Council, motion carried.

Ben Hansen reported the new water mains had been laid and tested to the Midway Service Station. He was instructed to contact Mr. Pulley in regard to his connecting on to the city mains for water.

Motion was made, seconded and on vote of the Council carried that the City of Canby petition the Highway Commission to take over the streets thru town that are used by the logging trucks.

Atty. Zimmerman addressed the Council, calling attention to several bills that will be before the Legislature, and discussed the effect they will have upon the City. The Recorder was instructed to write the Clackamas County members of the Legislature, expressing the Council's views on several bills effecting cities.

Councilman Stefani discussed the specifications for the building at the cemetery. Motion was made and seconded that the Committee be authorized to proceed with the building according to specifications submitted, septic tank to be included. Total cost to be \$505.00. On vote of the Council motion carried Yeas 8, Nays 0.

On motion, seconded and carried the Council approved the election of Chris Kraft, Jr. as Fire Chief.

On motion, seconded and carried City Atty. Zimmerman was authorized to grant a permit to W. A. Meek to lay a pipe line along the street to his place, permit to be drawn in accordance with requirements of the Federal Housing Authority.


Regular meeting February 3rd., 1941 continued.
