

March 3, 1941.  
Regular Meeting.

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held Monday March 3rd. 1941., 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Atty. Zimmerman, Chief of Police Hansen, Recorder Mangus and Councilmen Cutsforth, Everhart, Gesik, Koehler and Stefani. Absent Councilmen Pfister, Porter and Reynolds.

Minutes of the February meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Sickler, of the Bonneville Administration explained the new proposed electric rates. Mr. Reedy of the Canby Union High School requested the Council to purchase a net for the tennis court at the High School. Motion was made and seconded that the City purchase a net for the tennis court at the high school, cost to be approximately \$17.00. On vote of the Council motion passed.

On motion, seconded and carried the above claims were allowed. Yeas 5, Nays 0.

Mr. Lent stated that the pump in the 12" well would have to have new runners, installed cost to be \$90.00. Also recommended that a section of the old bell tower be erected at the springs for lifting out the pumps.


Atty. Zimmerman addressed the Council regarding the ordinance to rename the streets through out town. He stated that the renaming of the streets would disrupt all the existing records and plats. Ordinance # 326, renaming the streets within the city limits of Canby, was read by the Recorder. Upon vote of the Council ordinance #326 was passed on first reading and ordered posted.

Ordinance #327, establishing new electric rates for the City of Canby was read by the Recorder. Upon vote of the Council Ordinance #327 was passed on first reading and ordered published.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the Recorder be instructed to wire the the Clackamas County members of the Legislature also the Chairman of the Taxation & Revenue Committee, stating the Council's opposition to H.B. #505, placing a tax on all electric energy consumed.

There being no further business, on motion the Council adjourned.
