

Regular Meeting.
April 7, 1941.

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held Monday April 7th., 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Atty. Zimmerman, Chief of Police Haasen, Recorder Mangus and Councilmen Cutsforth, Everhart, Gesik, Pfister, Porter and Stefani. Absent Councilmen Koehler and Reynolds.

Minutes of the March meeting were read, after a correction was made in the reported cost of runners for the pump in the 12" well, minutes were approved.

A communication from the Western Golf Course Supply Co, regarding a power mower was read by the Recorder.

On motion, seconded and carried, State Ind. Acc. Comm. the above claims were allowed. Yeas 6, Nays 0. \$ 145.79

On motion, seconded and carried the purchase of two pair of handcuffs was authorized.

Lester Hess stated that some small pieces of equipment was needed at the Cemetery. On motion, seconded and carried the Cemetery Committee was authorized to purchase the necessary small pieces of equipment as needed.

City Treasurer Eid read his report for the fourth quarter of 1941.

On motion, seconded and carried the payment to Ross & Giger of \$5.00 per month, for keeping the city dump ground in an orderly manner, was authorized.

Ordinance # 326, renaming the streets within the city limits of Canby came up for final action. On vote of the Council was passed. Yeas 6, Nays 0.

Ordinance # 327, establishing new electric rates for the City of Canby came up for final action. On vote of the Council was passed. Yeas 6, Nays 0.

Ordinance # 328, Providing for the payment of the construction of the Cement walk and curbing around the park lots was read by the Recorder. Upon vote of the Council was passed on first reading.

Mayor Vinyard announced Claen-up days would be April 14th. thru 18th., pick-ups to be made on the 18th.

There being no further business on motion the Council adjourned.
