

Regular Meeting.
September 3rd. 1940.

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held Tuesday September 3rd., 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Atty. Zimmerman, Chief of Police Hansen, Recorder Mangus and Councilmen Cutsforth, Everhart, Koehler, Pfister, Porter, Reynolds and Stefani. Absent Councilman Gesik.

Minutes of the regular August meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Graham addressed the Council requesting that water mains be extended to his property. A number of Insurance Co. Representatives addressed the Council in regard to liability insurance.

After due consideration and discussion, motion was made by Councilman Pfister and seconded by Councilman Koehler that the lowest figure submitted on a liability insurance policy for the City, that of the Pacific Indemnity Co., Represented by Thomas and Telford of Oregon City, be accepted. On vote of the Council motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Vinyard announced that in the future all claims against the City for payment must be turned in before 3 P.M. of the day the Council meets.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the water main extension to the Graham and Pulley properties be referred to the Water Committee for investigation and to report at a later date.

On motion, seconded and carried the above claims were approved. Yeas 7, nays 0.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that Ben Hansen be authorized to move the traffic buttons and repaint parking stripes about town.

Lester Hess reported the opening of four graves during the month.

City Treasurer Eid exhibited his new account books to the Council.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the Mayor and Recorder be authorized to sign a petition for the City requesting the replacing of the old Knight Bridge with a new bridge.

Lester Hess addressed the Council stating that he had had some plumbing work done at the House occupied by him on the Cemetery property, and request that the City pay the bill of the Canby Plumbing and Heating Co., amounting to \$30.60. This matter was referred to the Cemetery Committee. On recommendation of the Cemetery Committee motion was made, seconded and carried that the bill of the Canby Plumbing and Heating Co. of \$30.60 for work at the house on the Cemetery property be paid by the City.

Councilman Koehler stated that some protection from the weather was badly needed for the grader. Motion was made, seconded and carried that the Public Property Committee be authorized to construct an adequate building to house the motive equipment of the City, also to have the roofs of the City Hall and the pump house repainted.

There being no further business on motion the Council adjourned. Approved October 7th. 1940.
