

Regular Meeting.
November 4, 1940.

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held Monday November 4th., 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Chief of Police Hansen, Recorder Mangus and Councilmen Gesik, Koehler, Pfister, Porter and Reynolds. Councilmen Cutsforth and Stefani reported later. Absent Atty. Zimmerman and Councilman Everhart.

Minutes of the regular October meeting were read and approved. Mr. Fridley of the High School Faculty addressed the Council regarding the erection of 225 street sign through out the City by the Sociology Class of the High School, providing the City furnishes the necessary material, the students to paint the signs and erect same. Motion was made, seconded and carried that the City furnish the necessary materials for street signs.

The Committee of Streets was instructed to report on the names of the streets through out the City.

Mr. McDonnell and a Mr. Cook owners of ten acres of property along the highway within the City Limits requested the extension of the water system along the highway to the City Limits.

John Bech, Raymond Weigandt and Richard Dodge of the local flying club requested the use of the City's grader to level the flying field. Motion was made, seconded and carried that the City furnish the grader and an operator to level the flying field.

On motion, seconded and carried the above claims were allowed. Yeas 7, Nays 0.

Ben Hansen reported the water system extension project was about completed.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that Ben Hansen be authorized to sell old 3½" pipe for \$2.00 per length.

City Treasurer, John Eid read his report for the third quarter of 1940. Motion was made, seconded and carried that the Treasurer's report be accepted subject to audit of the Finance Committee.

Ordinance #325, levying a tax on all the taxable property within the City Limits of Canby came up for final action. On vote of the Council Ordinance # 325 passed. Yeas 7, Nays 0.

The Street Committee was was instructed to confer with the City Attorney and empowered to take the necessary action to have the hazardous sidewalks about town be put in a safe condition of repair.

The Light & Water Committee was instructed to determine the number of prospective customers on the proposed Pulley extension.

After due consideration, motion was made, seconded and carried that the proposal of Roy R. Reed, submitted April 1st, 1940 to build sidewalk and curbing around the Park lots, be accepted.

Councilman Stefani requested that the City furnish a siren for the Fire Chief's car. After discussion motion was made, seconded and carried that the City appropriate \$20.00 to the Fire Dept. to be used toward the purchase of a siren for the Fire Chief's car.
