

December 2, 1940.
Regular Meeting.

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held Monday December 2nd, 1940., 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Atty. Zimmerman, Chief of Police Hansen, Recorder Mangus and Councilmen Cutsforth, Koehler, Pfister, Porter, Reynolds and Stefani. Councilman Everhart reported later, Councilman Gesik absent.

Minutes of the regular November meeting and special meeting of November 7th, were read and approved.

Applications for retail beer license from Canby Inn, Cliff's Cafe and Elmer Knudson were read by the Recorder.

The Finance Committee reported the approval of the Treasurer's report for the third quarter of 1940.

Mr. Koehler reported that the repair of sidewalks was under way. The Committee was instructed to check on sidewalks that roots of trees may be raising, if found in a dangerous condition, to have repair notices posted.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the three beer license applications of Canby Inn, Cliff's Cafe and Elmer Knudson, be approved.

A petition for the extension of the water system along the Pacific Highway was read. Motion was made, seconded and on vote of the Council, carried that a 4" water main be extended to approximately the City Limits along the Pacific Highway, main to be laid 3' deep. The Committee was instructed to get prices on pipe, estimate on cost of laying and report back to the Council.

Mayor Vinyard announced that a special meeting would be called to consider the naming of streets about town, also to receive the Committee's report on pipe.

Mr. M.J. Lee addressed the Council requesting that a new rate be established for electric heaters.

After some discussion motion was made, seconded and carried that a street light be installed at the corner of Second and Lee Sts.

Mayor Vinyard announced that an extra 5 mill road tax was voted at the special road meeting.

Councilman Everhart, speaking for the Cemetery Committee stated that the Committee recommended that a separate building be built at the Cemetery for the office, toolroom and lavatories, this building to be some distance from the pump house. Motion was made, seconded and carried that the Committee's recommendations be approved. The Cemetery Committee was authorized to use any old water pipe owned by the City. Was agreed by the Council that a reasonable amount be paid to the Caretaker for extra work done in the laying of water pipe at the Cemetery.

There being no further business, on motion the Council adjourned.
