

Regular Meeting.
June 3, 1940.

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held Monday June 3rd., 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Atty. Zimmerman, Chief of Police Hansen, Recorder Mangus and Councilmen Everhart, Gesik, Koehler, Pfister, Porter, Reynolds and Stefani. Councilman Cutsforth reported later, Mr. Lent absent due to illness.

Minutes of the regular May meeting read and approved.

A communication from Lester Hess proposing to take over the work at the Cemetery was read by the Recorder.

A representative of the Fairbanks-Morse Co. addressed the Council regarding a new motor for the pump at the springs. He quoted a price of \$168.00 for new motor, less an allowance of \$55.00 for the old motor.

Mr. J. P. Dozier, Spokesman for a group of Residents living in the N.E. section of town, requested the oiling of streets in that vicinity. Motion was made, seconded and carried that this matter be referred to the Street Committee.

Mayor Vinyard reporting for Mr. Lent, stated, that the W.P.A. expected to start on the water system project next Thursday, and that they would furnish their tools.

Fire Chief Kraft reported the Dept. answered one call during the month. The loss amounting to a few cords of wood. Also stated that the dept. would like to send three or four men to attend the Fireman's School to be held at Roseburg, and asked the Council to contribute \$75.00 toward their expenses. Motion was made, seconded and carried that \$75.00 be appropriated to the Fire Dept. to send four men to Roseburg for the Fireman's School.

Councilman Cutsforth reported the Finance Committee's approval of the Treasurer's report for the First Quarter of 1940.

Councilman Koehler reported that the pipe he had expected to purchase from the paper mill had been sold, that more would be available at a later date.

Councilman Everhart reported that the Committee was not satisfied with the figures they had received on ^{the} Liability Insurance policy. This matter was referred back to the Committee, with instructions to call a special meeting when ready to take action.

Motion was made and seconded that a price be established for the use of the grader and an Operator at the rate of \$3.50 per hour. Motion carried.

Motion was made and seconded that \$50.00 be authorized for payment of an audit of the City's books for the year 1939. Motion carried.

After consulting figures presented by the Portland General Electric Co.Motion was made and seconded that with the approval of Mr.Lent the City would purchase from the Portland General Electric Co.their line along the Highway at the North end of Town for the sum of \$177.57.On vote of the Council motion passed. Yeas 8,nays 0.


Motion was made,seconded and carried that the Cemetery Committee be authorized to have the necessary work done to obtain water at the Cemetery.

Mr.George Gabriel addressed the Council complimenting the City on the condition and the appearance of the Cemetery.Motion was made seconded and carried that the Council extend a rising vote of thanks to the Aurora Post #110,of the American Legion for the fine Patriotic and Memorial program conducted by the Legion at Zion Cemetery on Memorial Day.The Recorder was instructed to send a letter of thanks to the Aurora Legion Post.

After considering the communication from Lester Hess,motion was made,seconded and carried that he be hired by the month to take care of the Cemetery,as has been done in the past,sell and locate lots,issue permits and to take care of all details pertaining thereto for the sum of \$25.00 per month.Allowance for grave openings to be as follows:Vault size \$7.50,Standard grave \$5.50,Childs grave \$2.50,an extra charge to be made where curbing is necessary. On vote of the Council motion was passed.

There being no further business,on motion the Council adjourned.
