

Regular Meeting.
November 6th.1939.

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held Monday November 6th., 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Atty. Zimmerman, Recorder Mangus and Councilmen Cutsforth, Everhart, Gesik, Koehler, Porter, Reynolds and Stefani. Absent Chief of Police Hansen and Councilman Pfister.

Minutes of the regular October meeting and special meeting of October 16th. were read and approved.

On motion the above claims were allowed. Yeas 7-Nays 0.

Councilman Koehler suggested the widening of "A" St. This matter was referred to the Street Committee for consideration.

Councilman Gesik reported that Chief of Police Hansen was ill and that a temporary man had been put in his place.

Ordinance # 320, levying a tax on all the taxable property within the City limits of Canby came up for final action. On vote of the Council Ordinance #320 passed. Yeas 7-Nays 0.

The Recorder then proceeded to read a copy of the call for bids for fire fighting equipment. Bids from Howard-Cooper Corp. and the Neep Equipment Co. were then opened and considered. After due consideration motion was made and seconded that the bid of the Neep Equipment Co. with both alternates be accepted. On vote of the Council motion passed. Yeas 6-Nays 1.

Councilman Gesik suggested that some action be taken toward fixing up the City Park. Mayor Vinyard proceeded to name a Park Committee as follows: Harry Porter, George Koehler and R. Gesik. This committee was instructed to outline plans for the park and submit same for the Councils consideration at the next meeting.

Mr. Lent gave an outline of the proposed water main extension using 6" pipe. The advisability of applying for a W.P.A. ditch digging project was discussed. After discussion motion was made, seconded and carried that plans and plat be drawn for water system improvement and that application be made for a W.P.A. ditch digging project.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the necessary material for approximately 3200' of pipe line be purchased.

Mayor Vinyard announced that the Bonneville Officials would be here to meet with the Council Tuesday evening November 7th.

There being no further business on motion the Council adjourned.
