

Regular Meeting.  
March 6, 1939.

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held Monday March 6th. 1939. 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Atty. Zimmerman, Chief of Police Hansen, Recorder Mangus and Councilmen Cutsforth, Everhart, Gesik, Koehler, Pfister, Porter, Reynolds and Stefani.

Minutes of the February meeting were read and approved.

A beer license application of Jessie B. Roy, and a petition for the opening of 6th. St. were read by the Recorder. Motion was made, seconded and carried that the beer license application of Jessie B. Roy be approved. Mayor Vinyard stated that the opening of 6th. St. would be taken care of and referred the matter to Street Supt. Koehler.

On motion the above claims were allowed, Yeas 8, Nays 0.

Mr. Lent reported the Latourette springs flowing 250 gpm.

Fire Chief Kraft reported the Fire Dept. answered two alarms during the month, no loss involved, one of the calls being outside of town. He then introduced Mr. Taylor, Deputy State Fire Marshall, who explained the rural fire protection bill to be considered by the State Legislature.

Mr. Koehler recommended that some fills be made on Maple St. He was instructed to get an estimate of the cost of this work.

Mr. Everhart requested that he be relieved of duties in connection with the Cemetery. Mayor Vinyard announced that a special meeting would be held Monday Night March the 13th. to consider Cemetery matters.

M. J. Lee addressed the Council requesting that the City go on record in regard to irrigation for the Cemetery. Motion was made, seconded and carried that the Mayor and Recorder be empowered to make application for irrigation water at the Cemetery.

Mr. Lent stated that Mr. Olsen had made application for water service for his property which is located outside the City limits. The Council expressed themselves as preferring to improve the service within the city limits, before considering anything outside the City. The Water Committee was instructed to consider the improvements to be made this summer and to report at the next regular meeting.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the City purchase a lot, in block 14, from School Dist. #86, for the sum of \$1.00.

The problem of dogs running at large was referred to the Committee.

The Recorder was instructed to write the Highway Commission in regard to traffic control along the Pacific Highway thru town.

There being no further business on motion the Council adjourned. Approved April 3rd. 1939.
