

Special Meeting.
May 3rd.1939.

A special meeting of the Council was held Wednesday May 3rd. 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Atty. Zimmerman, Chief of Police Hansen, Recorder Mangus and Councilmen Cutsforth, Gesik, Koehler, Pfister, Porter, Reynolds, and Stefani. Councilman Everhart reported later.

, Mayor Vinyard announced that the meeting was called to consider a contract that had been submitted by the Bonneville Power Administrator. After due consideration and discussion motion was made, seconded and on vote of the Council passed, that a request be made to have the first paragraph of section nine and all of section eleven, deleted, before accepting the contract offered by the Bonneville Power Administrator.

The Recorder then proceeded to read bids submitted by J.L. Wallace, Sam's Garage and the G.W. White Motor Co. to furnish tires and tubes for the fire truck. Motion was made seconded and carried that the lowest bid, that of Sam's Garage for \$180.00, to furnish six tires and tubes installed on the fire truck, old tires and tubes to be turned in, be accepted.

Mr. Koehler recommended that the water mains in the Cemetery be extended. Motion was made, seconded that the Committee be authorized to make the necessary extensions.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the walks around block 14 be removed and the entire lot plowed.

Mr. Evans of the Portland General Electric Co. then addressed the Council in regard to the Bonneville contract for electric energy.

There being no further business, on motion the Council adjourned
