

Regular Meeting.
August 1, 1938.

The Regular monthly meeting of the Council was held Monday August 1st. 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Atty. Zimmerman, Chief of Police Warnstaff, Recorder Mangus, and Councilmen Cutsforth, Everhart, Gesik, Koehler, Porter and Rothenberg. Councilmen Pfister and Thompson Reported later. Minutes of the regular July meeting and special meeting of July 25th. were read and approved.

Communications from Fred C. Inkster and the State Industrial Accident Commission were read by the Recorder.

On motion the above claims were allowed. Yeas 8, nays 0.

Mr. Lent reported the completion of the water main to the Wicker corner, also stated the Latourette springs were flowing 530 gallons per minute.

Fire Chief Kraft reported, the department answered two alarms during the month, one a grass fire in town, the other a call from outside the city limits.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the Fire Chief report all lots in town that are fire hazards to the Recorder, and that notices be sent out to owners that same be cleaned up.

Mr. John Koehler and Fred Lamb addressed the Council in regard to their bids on the pump house roof. After some discussion motion was made, seconded and carried that all bids be rejected, new plans and specifications be drawn and to call again for bids on the pump house roof.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the Water Committee be authorized to have plans and specifications drawn and to call a special meeting when they are ready.

Mr. Rothenberg reported the approval of the Treasurer's report. for the second quarter of 1938.

Mr. Everhart reported there were nine places about town where traffic signs were needed.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the City Attorney be instructed to draft a new ordinance providing for safety and stop signs within the city of Canby.

The matter of naming of the unnamed streets within the City was left with the Committee to report at the next meeting.


Mr. Koehler stated that the Cemetery Committee recommended that the City contribute something toward the upkeep of the old Knight Cemetery.
