On motion, seconded and carried the above claims were allowed. Yeas 6, nays 0.

Fred Larson reporting for Fire Chief Kraft stated the Fire Dept. answered two alarms during the month, no damage. Also reported the old fire truck had been repainted and invited the Mayor and members of the Council to attend the County Firemen's meeting to be held in Canby May 24th.

Mr. Lent reported that some of the old electric line had been rebuilt and also that a line had been run to the telephone office.

The Recorder was instructed to get in touch with Mr. Smith of the Telephone Co. requesting a meeting for members of the City Council with the Telephone Co. Directors to discuss the installation of a fire alarm control in the telephone office.

The Finance Committee reported the Treasurer's report for the first quarter had been approved.

Water Committee reported no action taken on water storage as yet.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the Committee ask permission to install sirene temporarily on the Koehler building.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the sirene be installed temporarily on the Koehler Building.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the Building Comm. call for bids for constructing the hose tower.

Mr. Porter recommended that the water main be extended and a fire hydrant be installed back of the Shell oil station.

After due discussion motion was made and seconded that water main be extended and connect with 6" main and change standpipe to a hydrant. On vote of the Council motion carried.

Ordinance #81 came up for final action. On motion, seconded and carried was duly declared passed. Yeas 6, nays 0.

Ordinance #82 then came up for final action. On motion, seconded and carried was declared passed. Yeas 6, nays 0.

City Attorney Wait was instructed to draw up the necessary papers to close the Cemetery deal.

The Cemetery Committee, H.N. Everhart, George and John Koehler, were asked to draw up the preliminary plans for operating the Cemetery.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the Light & Water Supt. be authorized to get a Carpenter and have the necessary partitions and bins built using lumber taken from the old City Hall building.

Motion was made and seconded that the old barn across from the Methodist Church be declared a nuisance and that the Fire Chief be instructed to give the owner thirty days to have same removed. Motion carried.

M.J. Lee addressed the Council stating that street marker signs were needed about town. Mayor Vinyard replied that the City had had some rather heavy expenses recently and that he did not think that now is the opportune time take this matter up.

There being no further business on motion the Council adjourned.
