

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held Monday August 2, 1937., 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Rothenberg, Recorder Mangus and Councilmen Cutsforth, Everhart, Gesik, Koehler, Pfister, Porter, Rothenberg and Thompson.

Minutes of the regular July meeting and adjourned meeting of July 12th. were read and approved.

A card from the State Industrial Accident Commission was read by the Recorder, stating that a reduction of 15% would be made for the coming year, effective with the July report.

The matter of the Night Watchmans vacation was left with the Committee on Police matters.

On motion, seconded and carried the above claims were allowed. Yeas 8, Nays 0.

Carson Amrine addressed the Council in regard to the graveling of the street toward his place, also asked to have the water main extended to his and Mr. Grahams place. He was informed that work was about to be done on some of the streets about town. The matter of extending the water mains was left with the Water Committee.

The matter of licensing marble games was left on the table to be taken up at some future time.

The Finance Committee approved the Treasurers report for the second quarter.

Mr. Thompson recommended that the sirene be moved from its temporary location and that a permanent instillation be made.

After due discussion motion was made and seconded that the Building Committee call for bids on completing the hose tower. Motion carried.

Mr. Koehler reported that the first coat of oil had been put on the streets that were to be oiled, also signs had been posted routing logging trucks through town.

Mr. Lent stated that metal valve boxes now cost \$6.00, also stated that wooden boxes could be made for around \$1.00. He was instructed to use wooden boxes in the future.

After some discussion the problem of bicycle parking was left with the Police Committee.

Ordinance #86, vacating fifth street, came up for final action. On motion seconded and carried was duly decreed passed. Yeas 8, Nays 0.

Motion was made and seconded that the Committee on Public Property call for bids on the Old City Hall and Jail, lot to be cleaned up after the buildings are taken off. Motion carried.

Mr. Everhart gave a report of the work being done at the Cemetery, also requested the Mayor to call a Special meeting for Monday August 9th. to consider Cemetery matters.

Mayor Vinyard announced that a special meeting would be held as requested by Mr. Everhart on the 9th.

Mr. Lent recommended that the Mueller springs not be considered any further.

There being no further business on motion the Council adjourned. Approved September 7th. 1937
