

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held Tuesday September 7th. 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Atty. On motion, seconded and carried the above claims were allowed. Yeas 5, nays 0.

The bill of the Canby Hardware & Implement Co. for \$16.45 for work done on the pump at the Cemetery in January 1937 was rejected by the Council, as the City did not take over or receive the income from the property until August 1937.

Fire Chief Kraft reported that the Fire Department answered five alarms during the month, one house was a total loss, ^{LOCATED OUTSIDE} damage at four amounted to very little. _{OF CITY LIMITS}

Mr. Lent reported that the coil at the springs was burned out during the month, also recommended that Francis Skinner be paid 75¢ per hour for electrical work done for the City.

Motion was made, seconded and on vote of the council, carried, that Francis Skinner be paid 75¢ per hour for electric line work.

Mr. Lent then stated that all the water from the springs was being pumped into the tank. Mr. Everhart stated that the springs east of town looked pretty good.

The Committee on Public Property was instructed to go ahead and call for bids on completing the hose tower.

Ordinance #87, regulating the use of bicycles within the City Limits of Canby, was read by the Recorder. On motion seconded, and carried Ordinance #87 was passed on first reading and ordered published.

Mr. Everhart request that a price be set on the Cemetery lots, also stated that there was some talk of moving the old Miller Cemetery to the Canby Cemetery.

After some discussion motion was made and seconded that the following rates be charged at the Cemetery:
Opening and closing graves, Standard \$ 8.00, Vault \$ 10.00, Childs grave under 12 years \$ 5.00.
Full lots \$65.00, half lot \$32.50, single grave \$ 10.00.

On vote of the Council, motion carried.

Motion was made and seconded that the house on the Cemetery property be rented to John Steffenson this winter. Motion carried.

The Recorder was instructed to notify delinquent sidewalk accounts that 6% interest would be added after October 1st.

There being no further business on motion the Council adjourned. Approved October 4th. 1937.
