On motion, seconded and carried the above claims were allowed. Yeas 8, mays 0.

Fred Larson reporting for Fire Chief Kraft reported no calls

during the month.

Mr.Lent stated that the fire alarm sirene had been wired, and recommended that the City apply for Bonneville nower. He also reported that the High School had refused to pay their bill for the past two months.

Mr. Hall of the Loggers Equipment and Construction Co. of Portland addressed the Council in regard to the purchase of a

used grader.

Ordinance #89, permitting the operation and playing of pin-ball games in Canby, was read by the Recorder and came up for final action. Motion was made, seconded, and on vote of the council, carried, that this Ordinance be left on the table for future consideration.

Ordinance # 90, approperating \$495.00 to pay John Stefani for the construction of hose tower on the City Hall, came up for final action. On vote of the Council Ordinance #90 was passed,

Yeas 8, Nays 0.

Motion was made and seconded that the following heer license applications be approved: Canby Inn, Cliff's Cafe and Eugenee Service Station, on vote of the Council motion carried and applications were ordered approved.

The Recorder was requested to notify Robison, Scott & Scott that the new lock installed on the door to the Fireman's room

was not working as it should.

Ordinance #91, authorizing the payment of \$150.00 to Rebison, Scott & Scott for sidewalk construction was read by the Recorder. Motion was made and seconded that Ordinance #91 be passed on first reading and ordered published. On vote of the Council motion carried.

The Council then discussed the matter of street improvements that are to be made. The Recorder was instructed to notify Mr. Perrin that the road to Knight's Bridge was to be improved and that his pipe along this road would have to be moved.

The Recorder was instructed to take up with the League of Oregon Cities the matter of codification of City Ordinances. Mr. Hershberger, M. J. Lee and others addressed the Council in

regard to the pin-ball machine ordinance.

There being no further business, on metion the Council adjourned.
