

A special meeting of the City Council of Canby, Oregon, held pursuant to the preceding call of the Mayor, was held on the 29th. day of September 1936. Two-thirty P.M.

The meeting was called to order by the Mayor and on roll call the following answered present: Mayor Vinyard, Atty. Wait, Chief of Police Rothenberg, Recorder Mangus and Councilmen Bates, Cutsforth, Giger, Hornig, Porter and Rothenberg. Absent Councilmen Koehler and Thompson.

Mayor Vinyard stated the meeting was called to open bids for the new City hall, he then introduced Mr. Folger Johnson, from the Portland office of the Public Works Administrator. Mr. Johnson explained how the bids were to be opened and the award of the contract made.

Bids from the following Contractors were then opened: Robison, Scott & Scott-Teller Const. Co.-Curtis Gardner-Barham Bros.-Sig Ash-Henry Carl-G.E. Anderson-Odom & Skeels-Glen L. Ford and Robertson, Hay & Wallace.

After due consideration the following Resolution was proposed by Councilman Bates,

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS: An Ordinance was duly passed by the City Council, and signed by the Mayor of the City of Canby, Oregon, on August 3rd. 1936, providing for the erection of a building on the City property on the Southeast corner of Second and "B" Streets Canby, to be used as a City Hall and Fire House: And Whereas, the said City of Canby duly advertised for bids for the construction of said building and in said advertisement for bids duly specified that the work is to be paid for in whole or part out of funds furnished by the United States Government and all work and material must be performed and/or furnished in accordance with the rules and regulations relating to applicants and projects under the Emergency Appropriation Act of 1935.

And this Day, Tuesday September 29th. 1936, being the time specified in the said advertisement for bids, as the time at which bids would be considered, and the award made of the contract if a satisfactory bid is received.

NOW THEREFORE: All bids received being at this time duly considered and it appearing to the City Council here in session to pass on all bids received, that the bid submitted by Robison, Scott & Scott, of Portland, Oregon, is the most satisfactory to the City Council.

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, that the City Council of Canby, does accept the bid and award the contract for constructing said City Hall to the said Robison, Scott & Scott according to the terms, conditions and price \$10,677.00, being the basic bid less all alternates, set forth in the bid of said Robison, Scott & Scott, at this time submitted to the City Council.

The Mayor thereupon declared said Resolution carried and the Mayor and Recorder thereupon signed said Resolution in approval thereof.

Motion was made and seconded, that all certified checks and bonds be returned to the bidders with the exception of the three lowest bidders, these to be held until the contract with Robison, Scott & Scott was signed. Motion carried.

There being no further business, on motion the Council adjourned.
