

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held Monday April 1st. 8 O'Clock P.M. Councilman Thompson reported later.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Application for Retail Beer License were then presented for the Councils approval by M.H. Stephens and C.C. Marks.

Was regularly moved and seconded that application by M.H. Stephens be granted. On vote by the Council motion was declared Carried.

Was regularly moved and seconded that application by C.C. Marks be granted. On vote by the Council motion was declared Rejected.

Reports.

Fire Chief Larson reported a Volunteer Fire Dept. had been organized and read the bylaws of the Department. The Fire and Water Committee was instructed to look into the matter of insurance and compensation for the Fire Dept. Was moved and seconded to conform the election of Fred Larson as Fire Chief. Motion Carried.

Mr Lent reported more S.E.R.A. work would start the next day. He also reported some line trouble due to high wind.

Mr. Hornig reported the Pump House was moldy. The Fire and Water Committee was instructed to inspect same and make the necessary changes or repairs.

Was moved and seconded, That the required amount of one inch pipe be sold to Jack Wallace for 5¢ per foot. Motion Carried.

Mr. Koehler reported fifteen men would start to work on dry wells the next day.

Mayor Vinvard designated the week of April 15th. to 20th. as Clean Up Week. Pickups to be made the 19th. and 20th.

City Treasurer John Eid submitted his quarterly report for the period ending March 31st. 1935. On motion seconded and carried his report was accepted subject to audit of the Finance Committee.

An Auditors Report from Mr. J.P. Telford covering 1934 business was then read by the Recorder. Mr Lent stated that recommendations by the Auditor, in regard to records in the Light & Water Dept. had been adopted.

Ordinance #69 then came up for final action. On motion, seconded and carried was duly declared passed. Yeas, 8 Nays 0.

On motion, seconded and carried, the Council offered a \$25.00 Reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of anyone for destroying or defacing Public Property.

Mr. C.C. Marks then addressed the Council, requesting that the Council reconsider approval of his Beer License. On motion, seconded and Carried the Council reconsidered application of C.C. Marks for Beer license.

On motion made and seconded, to approve C.C. Marks application for Beer License. Motion declared rejected.

On motion seconded and carried Council adjourned.
