#### REPORTS.

Fire Chief Larson reported there had been one fire loss during the month, and recommended that several fire hazards around town be removed and that Firemen be appointed Special Police.

Mr Hornig stated a chimney should be put in the pumphouse. Mr Lent reported the roof was in need of repair. On motion, seconded and carried the repair of the pumphouse was left in the hands of the Committee to do as they see best.

Mr. Koehler reported the Railroad Co. expected to fix the "C" St. crossing. Also stated the roof on the City Hall needs attention.

Mr. Giger stated that there were a number of outside toilets around town that should be looked after, also the Porter neighborhood needed better fire protection. This was left in the hands of the Committee, the Committee on health to look after the outside toilets.

After some discussion as to establishing grades on all principal streets, it was left to the Committee to get bids on this work.

Ordinance #74 was then introduced. Was moved and seconded that ordinance #74 be passed on first reading and ordered published. Motion carried, and ordered published.

Ordinance #73 then came up for final action. On motion, seconded and carried was duly declared passed. Yeas 7, Nays 0.

On motion, seconded and carried. Council adjourned.
