

Regular Meeting;

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Monday Nov. 5th 1934. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Atty. Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder Fosmark and Councilmen Cutsforth, Hoehler, Gribble, Hornig Meeks, Porter, and Thompson. Absent Bates.

Minutes of the last regular Meeting were read and approved.

A letter accompanied by a permit from the State Highway Commission for crossing the Highway at Weed St. with the Electric Power line, was then read. Whereupon an application for a retail Beer licence was presented by Robert W Foy. After some discussion, it was regularly moved, seconded and carried that the application be recommended.

On motion, seconded and carried the above claims were allowed, Yeas 7 nays 0.

Reports;

Mr. Lent, reporting on the proposed changes on the Power line, stated that the estimated cost of this work would be about \$500.00 of which about \$100.00 would be for labor. After some discussion this matter was tabled to be acted upon at a later date.

Mr. Larson reported that complaint had been made about the cleaning and pressing plant being a fire hazard, and that Notice had been given to comply with regulations.

Mr. Porter reported that the new Fire hydrant had been installed. Mr. Koehler reported that a retaining wall would be necessary at Knight's bridge, also that the road should be raised before oiling.

Mr. Hornig stated that the Maple Corner was not being conducted properly in regards to the sale of beer. It was recommended that the proprietor be notified to comply with the law. He also stated that a retaining wall and some holes along the irrigation ditch needed attention, whereupon the Street Supt. was instructed to have these places repaired.

Mr. Koehler stated that the drain ditch at the North end of the City should be extended along the R.R. property to give proper drainage. It was recommended that an application for a permit be made to the R.R. Co. for the extension of this ditch. Councilman Thompson then urged that immediate steps be taken towards purchasing a new fire truck. Fire Chief Larson and A. Stefani also spoke strongly for the purchase of new fire fighting equipment. After some discussion it was moved, seconded and carried that the City purchase a new Fire truck. It was then Moved, seconded and carried that bids be called for to furnish a fully equipped Fire truck embodying a 500 Gal Pump, 100 Gal Booster tank, and combination Hose and ladder body. Bids to be opened at the next regular meeting of the Council no December 3d. Mayor Vinyard stated that a Special meeting of the Council would be called on Thursday Nov. 8th to canvas the vote of the Election. Mr. Hornig stated that the Light pole at the Knight's bridge hill had been removed and that the necessary grading could now be done under a S.E.R.A. project. On motion, seconded and carried Mr. Lent was instructed to purchase new mattresses and blankets for the City jail. Mr. Porter was instructed to confer with the Highway maintenance man regarding Safety lanes within the City.

There being no further business the Council adjourned.
