

Regular Meeting

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Monday evening Dec. 3rd. at 8:00'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard City Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder Fosmark, Councilmen Bates. Cutsforth, Meeks Hornig and Thompson. Absent Koehler, Gribble and Hornig. Minutes of the last regular meeting and Special meeting of Nov. 8th were read and approved. Communications from Oregon State Highway Commission and Eureka Fire Hose Co. were then read by the Recorder. The following claims against the City were then presented;

On motion, seconded and carried the above claims were allowed, Yeas 5 Nays 0.

Reports:

Mr. Lent reported that new mattresses and quilts had been purchased for the City jail, and that the flow of water at the springs was increasing. He also recommended that heaters be installed at the pump house to prevent the pump from frost, also that the sidewalk near the Shell Service Station be raised to prevent water standing over it. Mr. Bates stated that the sidewalk along Mr. Hess's property needed repairs. Mr. Thompson stated that some repairing should be done on the Street near the blacksmith-shop. After some discussion these matters were left to the Street committee to take care of. Mr. Bates recommended that two cotton wood trees on C Street be taken down as they were hollow and unsafe. On motion, seconded and carried the Street Supt. was instructed to remove these trees.

Mr. Porter stated that bids on the new fire truck had not been called for, as an Ordinance to purchase same would be necessary before bids could be accepted. Whereupon Ordinance No. 67 was introduced, and on motion seconded and carried was duly declared passed on it's first reading.

Mayor Vinyard stated that all labor, skilled and unskilled, would now be available on S.E.R.A. projects, and recommended that application be made for the project of changing the electric line on Weed Street and the other necessary repairs on the lines. On motion, seconded and carried Mr. Lent was instructed to make application for this project. M. J. Lee then addressed the Council, recommending that the City file on the water rights on the Molalla River for future power and light supply. This matter was dropped with no action taken. There being no further business the Council then adjourned.

ORDINANCE NO. 67

Entitled an Ordinance, declaring the purpose of the City Council of Canby, Oregon, to purchase a Fire Truck, and the necessary accessories thereto, for the use of the Fire Department of Canby.

Canby does ordain as follows, to-wit:

Section 1. Believing it to be necessary for the safety of property, and the best interests of Canby, that it should have more and better protection against fires, the City Council of Canby does hereby declare its intention to purchase, what it believes to be the proper and necessary Fire Truck and accessories thereto, for the use of the Fire Department of Canby.

Section 2. It is hereby understood and agreed that the cost of the Fire Truck and accessories, so to be purchased, shall not exceed the sum of four thousand dollars.

Read for the first time at the regular meeting of the City Council on Monday, December third, 1934, and ordered published, and to come up for final passage, at the regular meeting of the Council Monday evening, January 7th, 1935.
