The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Monday Feb.

5th 1934 at 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor

Vinyard, Atty Wait Chief of Police Lent, Recorder Fosmark, and Councilmen Bates, Cutsforth Graham, Meeks, Porter and Thompson. Absent Dimick and Hornig. Minutes of the last regular meeting were read and approved. Communications:

Aletter from the league of Oregon Cities relating to liquor licenses was read, also a letter from the Pacific Water Works Supply Co.of Seattle submitting prices and specifications on Chlorinators. A letter from D.P.Slater, Contractor requesting a payment on account was then read, also a communication from M.G.Ellis granting Mr Lent the privelige to haul electric light poles through the Camp Grounds near the Knight's Bridge, several bids to haulthese poles had been submitted and were then read by the Recorder. Claims against the City were then presented. It appeared that C.E. Johnson and H.B. Evans had both submitted Fire Insurance Policies on the City Hall. After some discussion it was moved seconded and carried that this Insurance be devided between these two parties in the amount of \$500.00 each. It was then moved, seconded and carried that D.P.Slater be paid \$800.00 on his account, Whereupon the Claims as follows were allowed. Yeas 6 Nays O.

Mr. Tiece was now introduced and spoke on Chlorinators he also left prices on the Wallace Tiernan machines with the Council for consideration Attorney Wait now read a letter from the State Highway Commission regarding parking of vehicles along the Pacific Highway within the City limits, he also presented an Ordinance covering this matter. Reports:

Mr. Lent reported that 10 men were working on the C.W.A project cutting electric light poles, also that changed the light line over to make room for the widening of the Pacific Highway, the cost of doing this work amounting to about \$50.00. He stated further that this line was set on a right of way secured from the State Highway Commission and asked the adviseability of charging the cost of making this change to them. After some discussion the Council instructed Mr.Lent to make out a bill covering the cost of making this change to them. the cost fo making this change and present same to the Highway Commission Attorney Zimmerman now addresed the Council in behalf of his client Mss. Nieland, regarding filling the Irregation ditch in front of her property and requested that action be taken to have this obstruction taken care of. Whereupon the Recorder was instructed to notify Mr. Blazier of the Irregation Co.to have this ditch filled within 10 days.

Mr Bates reported that the foundation and floor of the new pump house

had been raised two feet higher than it was first planed, also that the intake pipe had been increased from 6" to 10". He stated that the system would be completed in about a month and that the grounds should be fenced in as soon as possible. After some discussion the mater of selecting suitable wire fencing and calling for bids on wire and instalation was left to the Water Committee. also the setting of a date for the Council to consider these bids.

In reporting on the C.W.A. projects, Mayor Vinyard stated that the

Street project had been completted and at present 10 men were working

on the Electric line project. Chief of Police Lent was instructed to put the Curfew Ordenance in effect on Feb 12th after public notice had been given by publication. The bids to haul light poles were then taken up. the bid of A.Boe to haul and distribute thirty-five hundred feet of poles for the sum of \$35.00 was accepted.

Ordinance No 64 was then introduced and on motion, seconded and carried

was duly declaired passed on it's first reading.

ORDINANCE NO. 64
An Ordinance providing for the use and regulation of vehicles upon and over, and, or the obstruction in any manner, of the Oregon State Highway within the city limits of Canby, Oregon.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS, to-wit:
SECTION 1—The term Vehicle shall mean every mechanical device moving by any other power than human power, upon or over the Oregon State Highway, within the city limits of Canby, Oregon.
SECTION 2—No vehicle shall be parked or left to stand on said Highway and headed in the direction of traffic and with one front and one rear wheel of said vehicle resting not closer than one foot to the outside edge of the outside traffic lane of said highway.

There being no further.

Every driver of a vehicle or other conveyance traveling on any street intersecting said Railroad Avenue shall stop such vehicle or other conveyance at the place where such street meets the prolongation of the nearest property line of said Railroad Avenue before entering or crossing said Railroad Avenue, subject, however, to the direction of any traffic control sign or signal or any police officer at such intersection.

SECTION 6—Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof before the City Recorder of Canby, be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and be fined not to exceed the sum of fifty dollars, or be imprisoned not to exceed thirty days, or by both fine and imprisonment.
