

REGULAR MEETING:

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Monday, March 7th at 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard, Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder Fosmark and Councilmen Bates, Cutsforth, Koehler, Gribble, Hornig, Meeks and Thompson. Absent Porter. Minutes of the last regular meeting was read and approved.

Communications:

A letter from the League of Oregon Cities relating to the new FERA program was then read by the Recorder also a letter from Loretta Bridge relating to her buildings in this City.

Mr. Gabriel then addressed the Council speaking in behalf of a committee requesting the co-operation of the City with the High School Board in securing a FERA project to improve the play grounds at the school. He stated that the cost of building a double tennis court of concrete and fencing same would be \$800.00 to \$850.00. and that the High School Board would be willing to pay half of the cost if the City would pay the other half. Mr. Rev. Wright, Mr. Johnson Mr. Gurley and Mr. Markee all spoke of the benefits that derive from improving the play grounds and urged the Council to give their support in securing this project. After some discussion it was moved, seconded and carried that the City join with the Canby Union High School in securing this project of building and fencing a double concrete tennis court, the city paying one half of the cost of material. On motion, seconded and carried the above claims were allowed Yeas 7 nays 0.

Reports:

Fire Chief Larson reported that he had urged Mr. Reese to clean up the lot back of his place of business. He recommended that notice be published for all property owners to cut the grass on their property. He also urged the Council to take some action towards having the buildings of Loretta Bridge taken care of as they are bad fire hazards. The committee on Fire and Water was instructed to look these buildings over and were given full authority to take whatever action on the matter that they deemed necessary.

Mr. Hornig stated that the sidewalk on Main St. also on "D." were in need of repairs. On motion, seconded and carried the Street committee were instructed to look over the sidewalks and notify the property owners to repair them wherever necessary.

Mr. Lent reported that the meter boxes had been repaired where they had been damaged by traffic on streets used as a detour.

Mayor Vinyard reported that the Water Works Association were meeting in Eugene on May 10-11-12, and recommended that our Water Supt attend this meeting. He also stated that the State Board of Health insist that a Chlorinator be installed at the new pumping plant as soon as possible. The water committee reported that 3690 ft of pipe would be required to lay a water main from the new pump line to the Gribble property, and that 2" Galv. pipe at \$24.75. After some discussion it was moved, seconded and carried that an application be made to the FERA for making this improvement to the water system.

Mr. Bates reported that the roof on the old pump house was not worth repairing and recommended that a new one be put on when the weather conditions would permit.

Mayor Vinyard appointed E. Gribble to serve on the Light committee in place of A. Graham resigned. There being no further business the Council then adjourned.
