

REGULAR MEETING

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Monday June 5th at 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Vinyard Atty. Wait Chief of Police Lent, Recorder Fosmark and Councilmen Bates, Koehler, Hornig, Porter and Thompson. Meeks reported later, Absent Cutsforth and Gribble.

Minutes of the last regular meeting were read and approved.

Communications:

Letters from Carlton & Rosenkrans Co and A.F. Knight relating to repairing sidewalks was then read also a letter from Omega Machine Co of Kansas City Mo. relating to Chlorinators.

A representative of the Wallace Tiernan Inc. was then introduced, he spoke at length on the merits of The Wallace Tiernan chlorinators, He also quoted prices on two different types of machines at \$870.00 and 1150.00 respectively. After much discussion by the Council it was moved seconded and carried that the Water committee be authorized to purchase one of the \$870.00 machines also to make arrangements for terms and installation of same.

Reports:

Mr. Lent reported that the meeting of the Water Works Association which he attended at Eugene was very interesting and instructive. One of the subjects discussed being delinquent water bills, several Cities reported that they had these bills taken care of by the County. He also reported that the old dog pound had been removed.

Mr. Larson reported that the house of Miss Bridges had been torn down thereby eliminating a bad fire hazard, He also reported that gasoline had been stolen from the fire truck.

Mr. Porter recommended that the Water tank and tower be painted, On motion, seconded and carried the committee was instructed to call for bids on this work.

Mr. Koehler requested that the Street committee accompany him in inspecting the defective sidewalks and that the owners of such walks be urged to make repairs at once.

On motion, seconded and carried Mr. Porter was instructed to have Mr. Piatt cut the grass on the streets where necessary.

Mayor Vinyard reporting on the F.E.R.A. projects reported that maps had been made and that some action on these projects could be expected soon. The committee working on the cemetery deal were asked to investigate this matter thoroughly and report at the next meeting of the Council.

On motion, seconded and carried Mr. Lent was instructed to paint the roof of the new pump house with coal tar.

There being no further business the Council then adjourned.
