Reports:

Mr. Lent reported that the electric line had been put up for the connection of an electric stove at Mr Lee's residence. He also reported that the use of the City dump grounds had been made difficult due to p leaving debris along the bank instead of placeing it into the pit. due to people The committee recommended that parties known to have left debris on the bank be made to put same into the pit. They also recommended that the debris in the pit be burnt as soon as possible.

Mr. Lent reported further that the fire hydrant at the White Garage had been broken by an automobile driven by Jim Hampton, and that an entire new hydrant would be required to repair the damage, the cost of this repair amounting to about \$ 60.00 After much discussion it was moved, seconded and carried that the Chief of Police secure a warrant for the arrest of Jim Hampton to collect for this dammage.

Fire chief Larson reported that he had been called to put out a grass fire at the fair grounds. The Council authorized him to present the FALL With a bill for his services. He also recomended that a fire hydrant

equipped with pumper connection be installed at the White corner.

The committee of Police was instructed to secure extra police to work afternoons and evenings during the County Fair.

Mr. Bates reported that the cost of covering the old pump house with waterproof stucco would be about \$165.00 On motion, seconded and carried

the committee was instructed to have this work done.

Mr Porter reported that the Cemetary deal that the Association had the following assets Cash in banks \$1.084.00 Surity Bonds \$1,000.00 estimated unsold lots \$1,600.00 Uncollected \$ 240.00. He stated that the Miller farm adjacent to the cemetary could be purchased for \$ 4,000.00 or the Furre farm for \$ 6,000,00 After much discussion this matter was left to the committee for further investigation.

Mr. Porter recomended that steps be taken towards Securing new fire

fighting equipment, Whereupon the Mayor instructed the Fire-chief to secure specifications and aproximate costs and present same at the next meeting of the Council.
