

REGULAR MEETING

The regular monthly meeting of the City Council was held Monday Aug.7,1933 at 8 O'clock.

On roll call there were present City Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder Fosmark, and Councilmen Bates, Cutsforth, Dimick, Hornig, Meeks, Porter and Thompson, Graham reported later. Absent Mayor Dedman.

In the absence of Mayor Dedman, Geo.F. Bates presided. The minutes of the last regular meeting and those of the special meeting of July 11th. were read and approved.

Communications.

A letter from Gates Pipe & Investment Co. was now read. also a letter from President Franklin D. Roosevelt requesting all employers to sign his reemployment agreement in connection with the National Industrial Recovery Act. these communications were tabled to be acted on later. On motion, seconded and carried the above claims were allowed,

Reports:

Supt. Lent reported that several transformers had been moved and that electric service had been connected to the Berg Bros. warehouse, he also requested the Council to grant him his vacation, One week to be taken commencing next Sunday and an other week to be taken in October.

On motion, seconded and carried Mr. Lent was granted his vacation as requested. Mr. Dimick reported that the roads needed oiling and he recommended that they be oiled before the rainy season starts. After discussion Mr. Dimick instructed to estimate the cost of this work and as to when the County machine would be available to do the work. Mr. Cutsforth reported that complaint had been made about minors being on the streets after hours.

Whereupon the Curfew Ordinance No. 72 Passed and approved Feb. 6, 1906 was read, It appeared to the Council that this Ordinance was too stringent, after some discussion the committee was ordered to draw up a new Ordinance and submit same to the next meeting of the Council.

Whereupon Ordinance No. 56 came up for final action, and on motion, seconded and carried was declared adopted Yeas 7 nays 0

Engineer Gilbert now read his report on the proposed water system, after discussion the committee was instructed to prepare figures on three different methods of installations and to present same at an adjourned meeting of the Council to be held Monday evening Aug. 14th.

The letter of President Roosevelt was now taken up and on motion, seconded and carried, it was ordered that the City sign the Reemployment agreement.

Mr. Porter requested that some action be taken, the petition received by the Council recently asking for new fire fighting equipment. The committee on fire and water was instructed to investigate this matter and report at the next Council meeting. There being no further business, it was moved and seconded that the meeting adjourn until Monday evening Aug. 14th. motion carried.
