

SPECIAL MEETING

A Special meeting of the Council was held Sept, 21, 1933 at 7,30 o'clock. On roll call there were present Chief of Police Lent, Recorder Fosmark, Bates, Porter, Graham, Hornig, Meeks, and Dimick. Absent Dedman, Wait and Thompson. President of the Council Bates stated that the meeting was being held for the purpose of verifying the returns of the Special Election. The Recorder then read the returns as certified to by the Judges and Clerks of election, as follows

PROCLAMATION.

I, George F. Bates, President of the City Council and acting Mayor of the City of Canby, Clackamas County Oregon, do hereby proclaim and declare, that at a Special Election held in Canby, on September 20th 1933 which Special Election was held by virtue of an Ordinance passed by the Council on September 5th 1933, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of Canby for their adoption or rejection, the question whether Canby shall improve it's Water System by the construction of the necessary Tanks, Reservoirs and Pipe Lines, and procuring the necessary Pumps and such other machinery to operate them, so that the Water produced by the Springs located on the City property adjacent to the Molalla River can be utilized for the Water System of Canby, and for the benefit of it's citizens. And it is understood that said improvement as above set forth, is not to exceed in cost the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars.

Submitted to the legal voters of Canby Clackamas County, Oregon, for their adoption or rejection, at a Special Election held on Wednesday September 20th 1933
