

SPECIAL MEETING

A Special meeting of the City Council was held Tuesday Sept. 26, 1933 at 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder Fosmark, and Councilmen Bates, Dimick, Graham, Hornig, Meeks, and Porter, Cutsforth reported later. Absent Dedman, and Thompson.

President of the Council Bates stated that the meeting had been called to discuss the proposed Water project. He stated further that Chas. Thomas had offered to remove the trees around the springs, for the wood in them. He stated also that an easement through the Walgamat property for the sum of \$100.00 this would save 600 Ft. of pipe over the other route around by the road.

On motion, seconded and carried, Charles Thomas was permitted to cut the trees around the springs and taking same away, subject to the supervision of the Water committee.

On motion, seconded and carried, the Water committee was authorized to purchase an easement through the Walgamat property for the sum of \$100.00 After much discussion the Water committee was authorized to have Engineer Gilbert proceed with the complete plans and specifications for the proposed Water System, with the recommendation that one pump of 125 Gal. capacity and a 6 inch water main be installed.

The Water committee reported that they had investigated the cost of installing a cat-walk in the water tank tower. Stating that a permanent walk could be built for about \$50.00 Whereupon it was moved, seconded and carried that Supt. Lent be authorized to secure the necessary material and build the said cat-walk.

There being no further business the Council adjourned.
