

SPECIAL MEETING

A Special meeting of the Council was held Oct. 17th at 8 O'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Recorder Fosmark, and Councilmen Bates, Graham, Hornig, Meeks, Porter and Thompson. Absent Mayor Dedman, Chief of Police Kent, Councilmen Cutsforth and Dimick.

President of the Council stated that the meeting had been called to discuss the new water system and set a time for the calling of bids.

Mr. Meeks recommended that before any action be taken in calling for bids, that excavations be made at the springs to make sure that the flow of water will be sufficient. It appearing that the flow is now considerable less than a few months ago. After some discussion it was decided to have Engineer Gilbert superintend the excavation at the springs, before any further work be done. Mr. Bates stated that the trees around the springs would be removed so that excavating could be started Monday Oct. 23d.

The plans and specifications as submitted by the Engineer was now read by the Recorder. The different kinds of water pipe was now discussed.

Mr. Porter recommended strongly that cast iron pipe with pre-calked joints be used.

There being no further business the Council then adjourned.
